

DEVELOPMENT IN NW PRESTON

The Parish Council continues to monitor developments in NW Preston. Outline / full approval has now been given for 2,156 homes in Woodplumpton Parish in addition to 1,100 at Cottam Hall and over 500 approved at Eastway.

Many of the new homes have been given permission to connect into the existing sewer network and the Parish Council has put pressure on the City Council to discuss the capacity with United Utilities.

The City Council issued a new consultation on the NW Preston Masterplan which shows the key junctions on the E - W link road, suburban housing areas (shown in yellow on the map above) and the key service centres shown in purple, light green and red.

In conjunction with the above plan, an application for a 200 place children's nursery (to replace the unit approved on Lightfoot Lane) has been submitted at the junction of Sandy Lane and the E-W link road shown in blue on the map above.

A planning application has now been submitted for the E-W link road and the Preston West Distributor Road which runs from the M55 at Bartle Hall, past Lea Town, before eventually joining Blackpool Road. The plans were due to be determined by the County Council in September but it's looking likely they will not be determined until the New Year which may impact on the construction and completion dates.

With this delay in mind, the Parish Council has strongly opposed housing applications off Tabley Lane, north of the E-W link road as, if approved, it will lead to even more traffic and construction vehicles using the existing roads instead of the E - W link road.

FLOODING

Following the significant flooding of 2015, Lancashire County Council has launched a campaign to raise awareness of how people can be more prepared for flooding. www.lancashire.gov.uk/flooding
During a flood, water can rise quickly. If there is an immediate risk to life or you are trapped by flood water call 999. Follow these steps to stay safe

- Move family and pets upstairs, or to a high place with a means of escape.
- Move important items and documents upstairs or somewhere high and safe.
- Turn off gas, electricity and water supplies if flood water is about to enter your home.
- DO NOT touch any electrical appliances or cables when standing in flood water.
- Check vulnerable neighbours or relatives are safe.
- Avoid walking or driving through flood water.

Since 2015, various improvements have been carried out to the drains and sewers in Woodplumpton and the Parish Council has applied for a £5,000 grant to improve the field drains.
